Subject: Update to Genetic and Molecular Testing Payment Policy effective January 1, 2023

## Dear Administrator:

I am writing to make you aware that on January 1, 2023, Blue Shield of California (Blue Shield) will issue an update to the existing Genetic and Molecular Testing Payment Policy. This update will require that all providers include a Genetic Testing Unit (GTU), along with the genetic and molecular testing service procedure code, when submitting claims for genetic and molecular testing.

- 1. When billing an unlisted or non-specific code (for example, 81479), a procedure description is required with use of the Concert GTU (for example, *GTU-6V98G* or *6V98G*).
- 2. For all other codes impacted by this policy, Blue Shield recommends including the Concert GTU in the procedure description.
- 3. Providers are required to bill according to the CPT coding established on the Concert Genetics portal.

## **GTU Basics**

Every genetic test in Concert Genetics' platform has been assigned a unique identifier, called a GTU (genetic testing unit). The Concert GTU is a five-digit alphanumeric character string, structured as represented below:

Every uniquely orderable test on the Concert Platform has a unique GTU. GTUs can be looked up by anyone on the Concert Platform using the "Search" feature.
