Orientation

Understand managed care concepts, review residency learning experiences, and develop a yearlong customized residency plan.

Clinical programs – Direct patient care

Provide direct patient care through member and provider outreaches in the Clinical Pharmacy Operations Center (CPOC). Contribute to Commercial, Medicare, and Medi-Cal quality initiatives.

Drug utilization review

Review prior authorization requests, implement coverage policies, and present cases at clinical pharmacist rounds.

Formulary management

Participate in formulary strategy and drug/ drug class evaluations, make formulary coverage recommendations, and assess impact. Communicate updates and relevant information to members, providers, and other stakeholders.

Pharmacy and therapeutics (P&T)

Review and evaluate the current literature and respond to drug information related questions. Develop therapeutic drug evaluations and medication policies to present at pharmacy and therapeutics (P&T) committee meetings.

Pharmacy accounts and sales/product strategy

Perform or contribute to client presentations, requests for proposals from potential clients, formulary benefit design and disruption analyses, and other ad hoc client inquiries. Understand prescription drug rebates. Participate in endto-end implementation and evaluation of new and existing pharmacy product strategies across all lines of business, including assessments of feasibility and competitor landscape.
